

Flood of 1870

February 20, it rose 6 feet in an half an hour, hallowell train tracks swept away, the Hallowell-Chelsea bridge was destroyed, ice janes tore wall off roadside buildings.

Mar. 13th. The flood of 1936 began. (Could not find information on peaks and height)

Late March 1987. Rain starts falling rapidly in hallowell and rivers start overflowing.

April 2nd. Peak of Flood at 34.1 feet. Gov. Mckernan declares Maine in State of emergency.



Flood of 1896:

On March 2, flood was caused by an ice jam at swan island, water discharge was over 113,00 cubic feet per second, 3rd highest flood that has happened in Hallowell

Mar. 16th
The flood of 1936 ends. 5 died and 25 million dollars of damaged were recorded.

April 1st. Flood officially Begins in Hallowell. Waters rise about 9-10 feet.

April 3rd. Flood officially ends. There is 2 million dollars and 2000 homes hit.
